During a recent visit, Olympic bronze medallist rower Emily Ford captivated the children with an inspirational talk. The pupils were highly engaged and eager to learn about the qualities that contributed to her success, including how she overcame early shyness to develop the resilience required to compete away from home.

It was particularly striking for the children to learn that Emily had not even sat in a boat until the age of II, and that she honed her rowing skills at nearby Acton Bridge.

The session was further enriched by insightful questions from the pupils, who were especially impressed to hear that her sibling secured a gold medal at the same Paris Olympics in which she competed!
